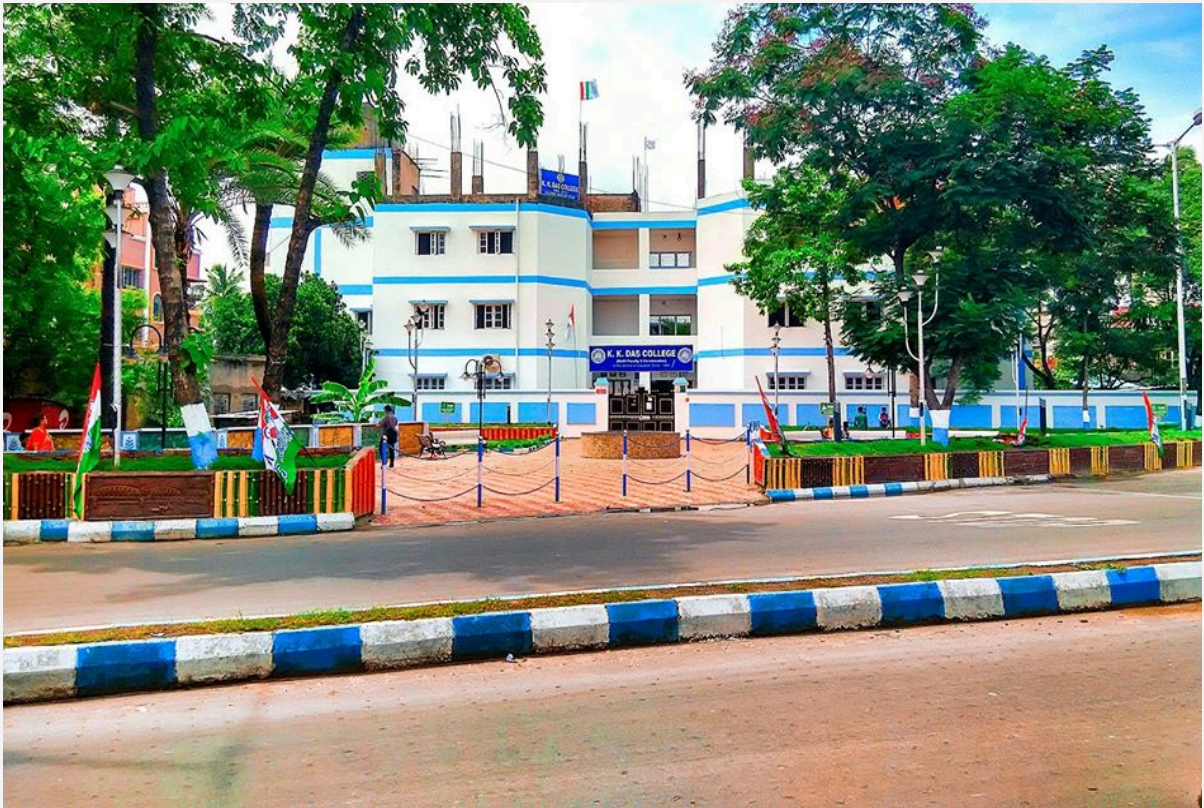

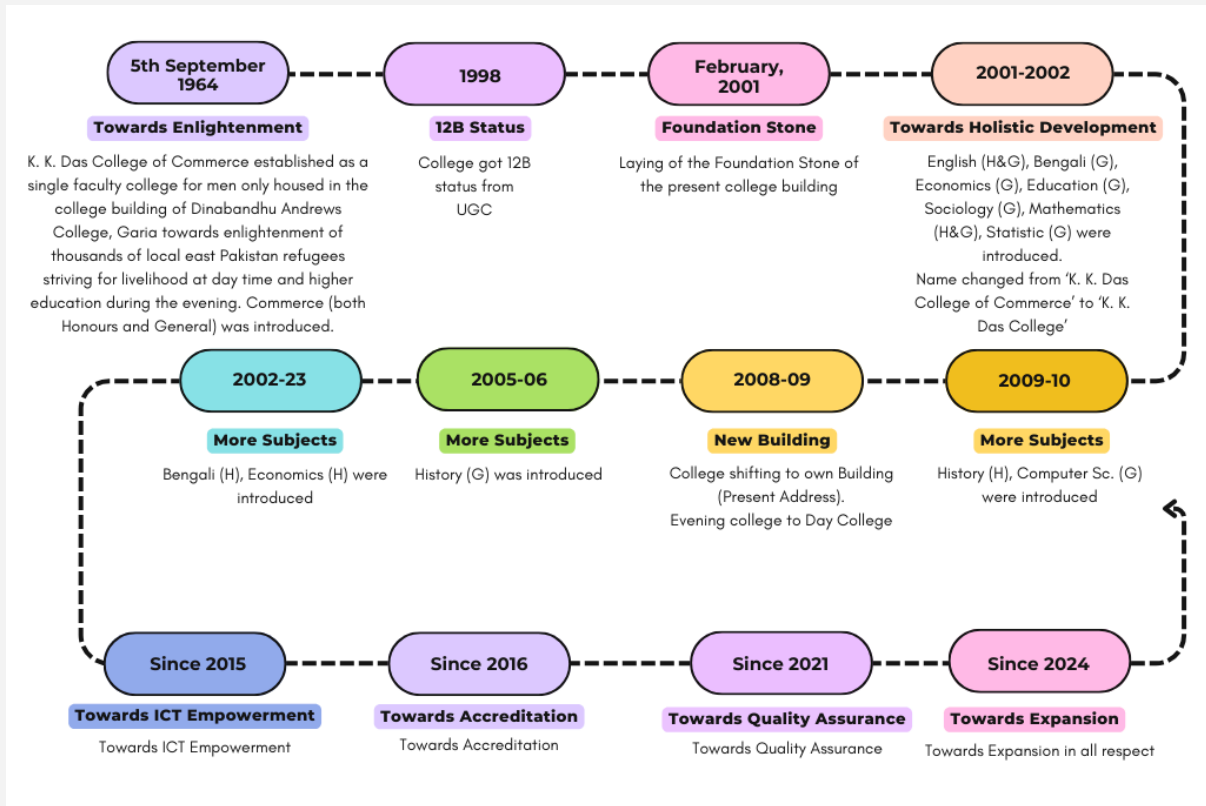

The college, formerly known as K. K. Das College of Commerce functioned from the premises of Dinabandhu Andrews College, Garia as an evening college for boys. It shifted to its present location in Patuli in the year 2008 and is currently running as a successful multi-faculty college with a dedicated team of teaching and non-teaching members.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ❖ Admission will be made according to the intake capacity of the subjects and strictly on the basis of merit.
- ❖ The candidates should apply for the desired courses online by logging onto the college website www.kkdascollege.ac.in.
- ❖ No enquiry should be made about the admission process in the college office. All information regarding admission will be available on the college website.
- ❖ The entire admission process will be conducted online and candidates should not come to the college campus for any enquiry about the admission process.
- ❖ Verification of documents of the admitted candidates will be done after the commencement of classes. The admission of candidates, who fail to provide necessary documents within the stipulated time period, will stand cancelled.
- ❖ Reservations for SC, ST, and OBC candidates and other conditions of admission shall be as per the rules of the Government of West Bengal and the University of Calcutta (C.U.).
- ❖ The online admission procedure is conducted with strict adherence to the stipulations laid down by University of Calcutta and under the meticulous supervision of the Admission Committee of the College.
- ❖ The decision of the Admission Committee will be considered final in all aspects pertaining to admission.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

1. Migration Certificate (M.C.):

The candidate coming from any Board / Council / University (other than WBCHSE / CBSE/ ISC and other such Board recognized by C.U.) will be admitted to the Semester I classes in any stream on payment of requisite Migration Fee at the time of his / her admission.

However he / she must produce his / her original M.C. issued by the Competent Authority of the concerned Board / Council / University within one month from the date of his / her admission.

If a student submits M.C. after one month from the date of admission, but within the permissible date(s) of C.U., then Service Charges as per rule will be levied by the college in addition to requisite fees of C.U.

2. Registration under Calcutta University:

Students admitted to Semester I classes for the academic session 2018-19 must apply for Registration to courses under C.U. in the prescribed Registration Form which will be available from the college office on the dates to be notified separately after completion of the Admission Process.

A student who fails to obtain Registration Certificate / Registration Number from C.U. under reasons whatsoever will not be allowed to appear for the B.A. / B.Sc / B.Com End Semester Examinations (as per C.U. rules).

A student coming from any Board / Council / University other than WBCHSE / CBSE / ISC must submit his / her Migration Certificate and a copy of his / her Mark sheet of the qualifying examination along with his / her application for registration.

3. (i) Change of Programme: Not permitted.

(ii) Change of Subject (without change of Programme): Permissible subject to availability of seats before the Registration procedure starts.

4. Percentage of Attendance:

- ❖ At least 75% attendance of the total classes delivered and practical classes held is necessary for appearing in the University Examination.
- ❖ The students with less than 75% but not below 60% attendance will be treated as non-collegiate candidates who may be allowed to appear in the examination on payment of requisite non-collegiate fees.
- ❖ A student attending less than 60% lecture delivered and practical classes held in one or more subjects / group of subjects shall be declared dis-collegiate and debarred from appearing in the university examination.
- ❖ As per university norms, the percentage of attendance secured by a student shall be used for evaluation of internal marks, which will be added up to the final score.

5. Examination :

5.1. College Examination:

There will be internal assessment in every subject to assess the continuous progress of the student. The marks obtained in internal assessment shall cumulate to the overall score of the student in a particular course of study.

5.2. University Examination:

- a) The 3 year B.A. /B.Sc. / B.Com. (Honours and General) Course of Studies under CBCS shall consist of Six (6) Semesters (Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester-V and Semester-VI).
- b) End Semester Examinations are to be held ordinarily at the end of the concerned Semester, i.e., Semester-I, Semester-III, Semester-V in **December-January** and Semester-II, Semester-IV, Semester-VI in **June-July**.
- c) End Semester Examinations will be held for 80% of the total marks in each paper and Internal Assessment shall be for 20% of the total marks of each paper/subject/module. 50% of the total marks assigned to Internal

Assessment will be assessed on the basis of Internal Examination and remaining 50% will be assessed based on the class attendance.

6. Notice Board:

Students should check the College Notice Board regularly for relevant information. Non-compliance of any notice shall not be accepted.

7. Identity Card:

After admission to the college, every student will be issued an Identity Card, which he / she should always carry. **Wearing ID Cards is mandatory for all the students while they are within the college premises.**

8. Library Card:

Students need to furnish their fee receipt and the College Identity Card to become a member of the Library. A Library Card is issued to each member. The Library offers yearly membership which is renewed subject to clearance at the time of issuance of admit card for University Semester Examination.

Rules and Regulations

1. No student will be allowed to enter the college without an Identity Card.
2. The students have to be punctual in attending both Theoretical and Practical classes.
3. It is required that college monthly fees should be paid within the 30th of every month.
4. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
5. Students should keep the college campus clean.
6. Pasting posters and writing anything on the college walls is strictly prohibited.
7. Destroying and damaging the college property is punishable.
8. Visiting hours for meeting the Principal:

Students: 2:00pm to 5:00pm
9. Students must not loiter and shout in the corridors during class hours.
10. **Students are strictly advised not to bring outsiders in the college campus without the prior permission of the College authority/Principal.**
11. The student should abide by the rules and regulations of the college. The college authority may take disciplinary action if any student violates the college rules and regulations.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT

1. LIBRARY

The College Library is situated on the 1st Floor, Room No.: 206. Our Library has a rich collection of text-books which is used productively by our students and teachers.

Every year there is a fresh purchase of books from the UGC Grants.

Presently the total number of books in the library is more than 13000. The

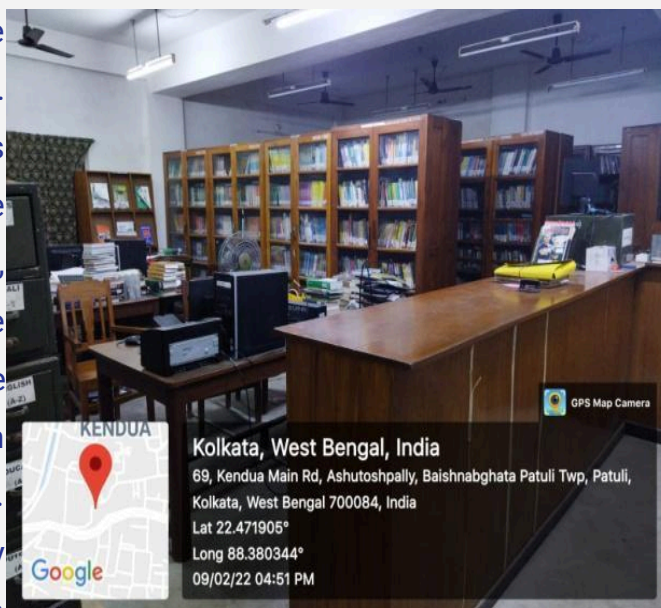
library subscribes to 14 journals, magazines and periodicals. The

College is also registered with the N-LIST project (digital library) which

provides access to e-resources i.e. e-journals and e-books. The library

boasts of a collection of books which

are necessary for competitive examinations and job training. Some e-books are also available in CD / DVD form in our library. The work of computerization of the library is in progress. OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) has been introduced in our library which will help the students to gain easy access to books and other resources. The Library has computers which provide access to e-journals and other e-resources to the students.

The following rules regarding the library should be strictly followed by the students:

- Students can take home two (2) books at a time for maximum ten (10) days.
- Students can take two (2) books at a time for Reading Room use only.
- Journals, Magazines, Reference Books are not for lending and students will not be allowed to take those documents outside the library.
- A fine of Rs. 1.00 per day per book will be charged for books kept beyond the due date.
- The loss of Library Card must be reported immediately and an amount of Rs. 20.00 will be charged for a duplicated Library Card.
- In case of loss of borrowed books the books have to be replaced by a new one.
- Students are to deposit all books before filling up the form for University Examination.
- No books will be issued to the students after filling up the form for University Examination.

2. Departmental Book Bank:

Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, History and Bengali departments have Book Banks consisting of text books and reference books.

3. Central Computer Laboratory :

Computer Lab is an ICT infrastructure having 30 computers to promote network based knowledge and learning. ICT infrastructure provides internet connectivity through Wi-Fi and LAN. It also facilitates students and faculty to access a world class teaching and learning system.



4. Wi-Fi Campus:

College-wide wireless internet access is available for the students during college hours.

5. Virtual Classroom:

A virtual classroom has been introduced and developed from the academic session 2017-18. In this virtual classroom, teachers can deliver lectures more effectively by using audio-visual aids and by providing study materials from internet resources to the students.

6. Audio-Visual Teaching Gadgets:

Some classrooms are fitted with an audio-visual system which facilitates effective communication between students and teachers. Moreover lectures delivered with the aid of LCD projectors make the teaching-learning process interesting for the students.

7. Language Lab:

Language Lab facility is available in the college free of cost for students who are interested in learning languages like English, Spanish, German.

8. Uninterrupted Power Supply:

A heavy duty generator ensures uninterrupted power supply in the entire college premises.

9. Canteen:

There is a college canteen for students on the campus. It is a refreshment centre as well as a favourite hangout spot for the students. It offers a wide variety of foods at subsidized rates.

10. Students' Recreation Centre:

There are separate common rooms with indoor games facilities for boys and girls.

11. Students' Health Home:

The college students are entitled to medical facilities provided by the Students' Health Home of the Govt. of W.B.

12. Placement Cell:

From the academic session 2017-18, a Placement Cell has been formed in the college with the aim of helping students to find employment in various sectors. In 2018, few final year students have been absorbed as management trainees in a reputed organization. The college has also entered into an agreement with the organization in which they will train ten students of the college in every semester.

The college also organizes a Career Fair for the students in which different corporate houses, Training Institutes and Indian Air Force take part with many offers and opportunities. The college library has books that are relevant to the preparation of competitive examinations.



13. Computer Training Facility:

Apart from providing regular courses, the college offers short-term computer literacy courses to the B.A. and B.Sc. students.

14. Seminar for the students:

In addition to regular classroom teaching-learning, seminars are arranged for the students of each course of study at regular intervals where eminent scholars in the particular field deliver lectures. These lectures are beneficial for students in order to gather additional knowledge in their subject and work further towards enriching their minds.

15. Add on Course:

In the previous sessions, the College in collaboration with an external agency (ESSR Infosys) has provided a number of certificate courses. A good number of students have shown interest by enrolling in these courses. These courses are conducted in the college premises before the usual college hours keeping the regular class routine undisturbed.

Additional Endeavours

1. Guardians meet:

We arrange several sessions where we interact with the guardians of the students in order to discuss the progress of their wards.

2. Online Feedback System:

Students can give their valuable feedback on the college-website concerning the administration and education being imparted at the college.

3. Online Repository of Study Materials:

The faculty members have created an online repository of study materials for all subjects of study to provide additional knowledge to the students. This repository is accessible on every departmental page through the college website and can be accessed both inside and outside the college.

4. UGC Seminars:

National/State level UGC seminars, lectures are organized by various departments in which not only the students and staff of the college but also distinguished academicians from other institutions and eminent personalities participate.

Student life at KKDC

1. NSS :

The college has a National Service Scheme (Recognized by CU) running successfully since 2010. We take immense pride that our students have been devotedly engaged in organizing Blood Donation Camps, Health Camps, Awareness Programmes, and Social Awareness Camp. Our NSS Volunteers also take part in the special camps organized by the NSS unit of the college at nearby underprivileged areas.



2. NCC:

The NCC unit of our college has been opened since the last academic session. The NCC Air Squad 2 Wing of this college functions under the control of Air Squad 2 Bengal Battalion, Jadavpur University. The sanctioned cadet strength of our NCC unit is 30. Through NCC students are given basic military training which aims to develop character, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and the ideals of selfless service amongst the students. It also stimulates student's interest in the defense of our country. All students are encouraged to join NCC voluntarily.

3. Eco Club :

The Eco Club of KKDC started functioning from the year 2015. The main purpose of Eco Club is to enable students to feel, think and be aware of the environmental issues. It organizes activities such as cleaning of the campus, plantation of trees etc.



4. Literary Society:

The Literary Society of KKDC was formed in 2015 and it aims to develop the students into promising individuals by providing them a platform to sharpen their inherent skills of composition, eloquence etc. It organizes activities like Creative Writing Competition, Debating Competition, Creative Writing Workshop with eminent external experts and movie screenings. By participating in these activities, the students gain the requisite exposure to become confident individuals in the future.

5. Cultural Society :

The Cultural Society of the college bears responsibility of creating a cultural atmosphere on campus. Various cultural programmes are organized by the Cultural Society. The students actively participate and perform well in various competitions outside the campus by obtaining guidance from the Cultural Society. Workshops and competitions on elocution are held at regular intervals.



6. Equal Opportunity Cell:

This cell works for an equal right for every single student in every field of society, and arranges various seminars and workshops round the year, with many NGOs and social worker groups like SUTANUTIR SAKHYA , BEAUTIFUL MIND KOROK, MENTAID, SWAYAM. These workshops are meant for awareness and sensitization mindsets about the right of good living of every human being in this society irrespective of gender, class, caste or physical or mentally challenged state. Students take part in both internal and external activities on behalf of the college in various events, such as day-long inter-college competition, road show or walk. This cell also observes days like International women's day, International day for persons with disability, etc. This cell also works for settling grievances of students.



7. Educational Tours :

Different departments of the college organize educational excursions to places to provide the students exposure outside their college life within the campus.



8. Students' Union :

Students' Union is a statutory body and an integral part of the college consisting of class representatives elected by the students of the college. It has many sub-committees to conduct different co-curricular activities e.g. Games & Sports, Cultural & Social functions, Students' Welfare etc. As per rule, the General Secretary of the elected Students' Union is a member of the Governing Body of the college.

13. Prize Distribution Ceremony :

Prizes are distributed to the University examination toppers, winners of debate, Extempore speech and Quiz Competition.



14. Rock Climbing/ Trekking:

From the academic session 2016-17, the college has organized the activity of Rock Climbing/Trekking. In 2016, the students were taken to Mathaburu Hills under the supervision of teachers of the college. This exciting activity will be continued in the coming sessions.
