2. A candidate shall be allowed to take up Hons. in Economics if he /she has passed in Mathematics or Business Mathematics of ISC with 100 marks in the previous qualifying examination.
3. A candidate shall be allowed to take up Hons. in Mathematics if he/she has passed in Mathematics and not in Business Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission will be made according to the intake capacity of the subjects. The whole admission procedure will be strictly conducted online. Reservations for SC, ST, and OBC candidates and other conditions of admission will be as per Government of W.B. and Calcutta University rules.

The online admission procedure is conducted with strict adherence to the stipulations laid down by Calcutta University and under the meticulous supervision of the Admission Committee of the College. The decision of the Committee will be considered final in all aspects pertaining to admission.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

1. Migration Certificate:

The candidate coming from any Board / Council / University (other than WBCHSE / CBSE/ ISC and other such Board recognized by CU) may be admitted provisionally to the 1st year Degree classes in any stream on payment of requisite Migration Fee at the time of his / her provisional admission.

However he / she must produce his / her original M.C. issued by the Competent Authority of the concerned Board / Council / University within one month from the date of his / her provisional admission.

If a student submits M.C. after one month from the date of admission, but within the permissible date(s) of CU, then Service Charges as per rule will be levied by the college in addition to requisite fees of CU.

2. Registration under Calcutta University:

All students admitted to the Part – I Degree classes must apply for registration of their names under Calcutta University in the prescribed Registration Form which will be available from the college office on the dates to be notified separately after completion of Admission Process.

A student who fails to obtain Registration Certificate / Registration Number from CU under reasons whatsoever will not be allowed to appear for the BA / BSc / B.Com Part – I Examination (as per CU rules).

A student coming from any Board / Council / University other than WBCHSE / CBSE / ISC must submit his / her Migration Certificate and a copy of his / her Marksheet of the qualifying examination along with his / her application for registration.

3. (i) Change of Stream : Not permitted.

(ii) Change of Subject (without change of Stream).

Students may be allowed to change only one subject in the General Paper at the discretion of the Principal before the University Registration form fill up in the 1st year of the course.

4. Admission on Transfer:

Admission on Transfer from other institute to 1st and 2nd year classes is permitted at the discretion of the Principal and subject to availability of seats.

5. Enrolment of Unsuccessful Candidates:

The students, who fail in Part I / II / III Examination of a year and those who are eligible as per CU rules to appear at the same or Compartmental Examination in the next year, must register their names by filling up Casual Admission Form on payment of requisite fees. They are required to fill up Examination Form and deposit requisite fees on scheduled dates as notified by the College Authority / CU.

6. Percentage of Attendance:

- At least 75% attendance of the total classes delivered and practical classes held is necessary for appearing in the University Examination.

- The students with less than 75% but not below 60% attendance will be treated as non-collegiate candidates who may be allowed to appear in the university examination on payment of requisite non-collegiate fees.

- A student attending less than 60% lectures delivered and practical classes held in one or more subjects / group of subjects shall be declared dis-collegiate and shall be debarred from appearing in the university examination.

7. Examination :

College Examination

Mid-term and Selection Test will be held in accordance with the schedule circulated by CU. In addition to these, class tests are held at regular intervals.

There is a facility for online MCQ type examination for all subjects available on the website of the college. The students can evaluate their progress by appearing for these examinations at any time within and outside the college.

Appearing in the examinations and securing the requisite marks are essential for the students to be eligible for appearing in the University Examination.

University Examination

University takes three Final Examinations for B.A., B.Sc., B.Com Honours and General Courses at the end of Part –I, Part – II and Part – III respectively.

8. Notice Board:

Students should make it a habit to read the Notice Board regularly to check notices for schedule of classes, examinations, holidays, activities and other relevant informations. Non-awareness of any notice will not be accepted as an excuse for any delay in any matter.

9. Identity Card:

After admission to the college, every student will be issued an Identity Card, which he / she should always carry and present as and when asked for. The Card must be returned when a student leaves the college.

10. Library Card:

Students need to furnish their fee receipt and the College Identity Card to become a member of the Library. A Library Card is issued to each member. The Library offers yearly membership which is renewed and is subject to Annual Clearance at the time of the form fill up for University Examination.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

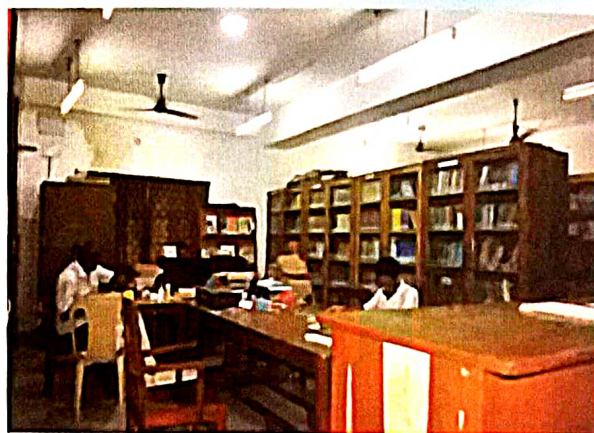
1. The student should abide by the rules and regulations of the college. The college authority may take disciplinary action if any student violates the college rules and regulations.
2. No student will be allowed to enter the college without Identity Card.
3. Provisional Admission to the 2nd and 3rd year is compulsory for attending classes and entering the college.

4. The students have to be punctual in attending both Theoretical and Practical classes.
5. Honours students have to obtain at least 40% marks in aggregate in all college examinations for eligibility to appear in the University Examinations.
6. General students have to obtain at least 30% marks in aggregate in all college examinations for eligibility to appear in the University Examinations.
7. Appearance in the Selection Test is mandatory. Absence from examinations without valid reason would be treated as violation of College Norms. The College Authority may take strict action in this regard.
8. It is required that all monthly fees should be paid within 30th of every month.
9. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
10. The students will take care in keeping the college campus clean.
11. Pasting posters and writing on either of the forces of the college walls is strictly prohibited.
12. To destroy and damage the college property is punishable.
13. The students should be modest to the teachers and staff of the college.
14. Visiting hours of the Principal :
 Outsider : 3.00 p.m. to 5 p.m.
 Attestation after 2.00 p.m.
15. Students must not loiter and shout in the corridors during class hours.
16. Students are strongly advised not to bring outsiders inside the College Campus.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT

1. LIBRARY

The College Library is situated in the 1st Floor, Room No.: 206. Our Library has a rich collection of text-books which is used productively by our students and teachers. Every year there is a fresh purchase of books from the UGC Grants. Presently the total number of books in the library is more than 13000. The library subscribes to 14 journals, magazines and periodicals. The College is also registered with



N-LIST project (digital library) which provides access to e-resources i.e. e-journals and e-books. The library boasts of a collection of books which are necessary for competitive examinations and job training. Some e-books are also available in CD / DVD form in our library. The work of computerization of the library is in progress. Recently OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) has been introduced in our library which will help the students to gain easy access to books and other resources. The Library has computers which provide access to e-journals and other e-resources to the students.

The following rule regarding library should be strictly followed by the students :

- Please maintain silence in the library.
- Loitering, gossiping, smoking, eating, sleeping in the library are strictly prohibited.
- Taking Mobile Phones is strictly prohibited in the library.
- Students will not be allowed in the library without Library Card.
- Students have to produce their Library Card for consulting books, journals and any documents in the library.

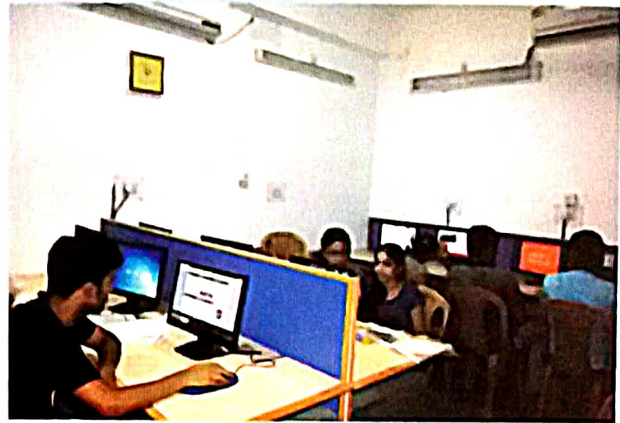
- Students are requested to sign the Reading Room Register mentioning 'in time' before using the reading room and also sign 'out time' before leaving the library.
- Students are asked to deposit their bags and other materials in the separate counter before entering the library.
- Request for stationery items are not permissible.
- Mutilation of library materials and damaging the library property are serious offences and is liable to punishment.
- Journals, Magazines, Reference Books are not for lending and students will not be allowed to take these documents outside the library.
- Without a requisition slip, properly filled up by the students, no book will be issued.
- Students are asked to check the books at the time of issue.
- The students, to whom, the book was last issued, would be held responsible for any type of damage or mutilation, detected at the time of return.
- No book in damaged condition will be accepted from the students.
- Students can take home two (2) books at a time for maximum ten (10) days.
- Students can take two (2) books at a time for Reading Room use only.
- Those books will be issued for one night only which have limited number of copies in the library.
- Books are to be returned on the date last stamped on the Book-slip.
- A fine of Re. 0.50 per day per book will be charged for books kept beyond the due date.
- Fine will be received at the Cash Counter.
- The loss of Library Card must be reported immediately and an amount of Rs. 20.00 will be charged for a duplicate Library Card.
- In case of loss of borrowed books, the books have to be replaced by new ones.
- Students are to deposit all books before filling up the form for University Examination.
- No books will be issued to the students after filling up the form for University Examination.
- All members associated with the institute should obtain Clearance Certificate from Library before being released from the Institute.
- Notice board should be followed from time to time.

1. Departmental Book Bank:

Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, History and Bengali departments have Book Banks consisting of text books and reference books.

2. Central Computer Laboratory :

Computer Lab is an ICT infrastructure having 30 computers to promote network based knowledge and learning. It provides a framework of services that enables all staffs and students to access up-to-date information and academic developments. ICT infrastructure provides internet connectivity through Wi-Fi and LAN. It also facilitates students and faculty to access a world class teaching and learning system.



3. Wi-Fi Campus:

College-wide wireless internet access is available freely for the students during college hours.

4. Audio-Visual Teaching Gadgets:

Classrooms are fitted with audio system which facilitates effective communication between students and teachers. Moreover LCD projectors are regularly used to make academic matters more interesting and accessible.

5. Uninterrupted Power Supply:

A heavy duty generator ensures uninterrupted power supply in the entire college premises.

6. Canteen:

The College Canteen is located on campus. It is a popular spot for social interaction of the students. It offers a variety of foods, snacks and tea at subsidized rates.

7. Cycle Stand:

For the convenience of the students coming to the college on cycles from neighbouring areas, the college has set up a cycle stand.

8. Students' Recreation Centre:

There are separate common rooms with indoor games facilities for boys and girls.

9. Students' Health Home:

The college students are entitled to medical facilities provided by the Students' Health Home of the Govt. of W.B.

10. Career Counselling:

College organizes Career Fair for the students in which different corporate houses, Training Institutes and Indian Air Force take part with many offers and opportunities. In order to assist students in their careers after college, online mock-test facilities, pertaining to several government services, are available on the college's official website. The college library also has books that are relevant for the preparation of competitive examinations, organized categorically in a separate bookshelf. In case of the requirement for further assistance and career counseling, students can always approach the teachers. This helps the students to a great extent in their future planning.



11. Computer Training Facility:

Apart from providing regular courses, the college offers short-term computer literacy courses to the B.A. and B.Sc. students.

12. Add on Course:

The College has introduced in collaboration with an external agency (ESSR Infosys) the following certificate courses in :

- 1) Teachers' Training
- 2) Multimedia and Animation
- 3) Financial Accounting
- 4) Communicative English

A good number of students have shown interest in getting enrolled in these courses. These courses are conducted in the college premises according to the teaching schedule and conveniences keeping the regular class routine undisturbed.

13. Profile Mapping:

This is an on line IQ and EQ testing facility which provides each student a platform to understand their strengths and weaknesses.

14. Garden:

In spite of constraints of space, the college has developed a small and beautiful garden with trees, flowering plants and herbs which helps in providing a better atmosphere to the students of the college.

15. Badminton / Volleyball Court:

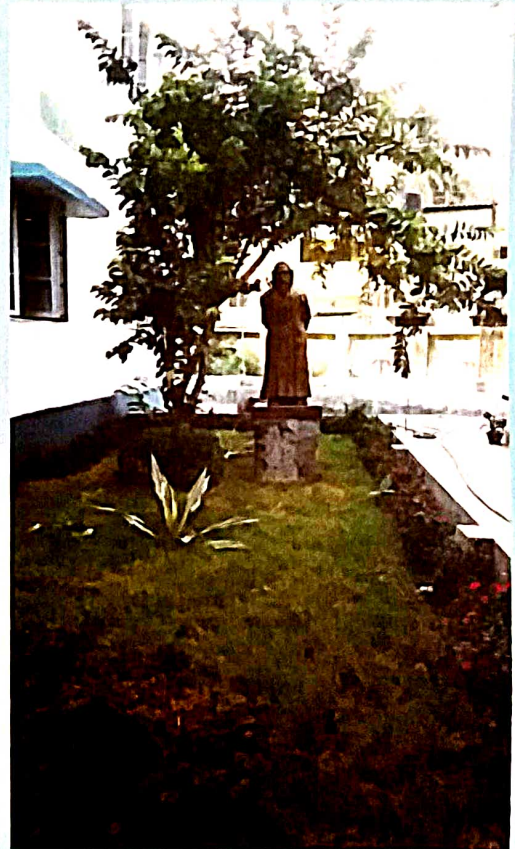
The college has a badminton and volleyball court in front of the premises.

16. Playground:

The college has arranged for a provision for the students to use the 'Upanagri Udyan' of KMDA as a playground, whenever required.

17. Lectures & Seminars:

National / State level UGC seminars and lectures are organized from time to time in various departments in which not only the students and staff of the college but also distinguished academicians and eminent personalities from outside the college participate.



ADDITIONAL ENDEAVOURS

1. Tutorial Classes:

In addition to the regular classes, additional tutorial classes are arranged for the slow learners, when required, during the regular session, as well as after the commencement of the study-leave before the University examinations.

2. Guardians meet:

We arrange several sessions where we interact with the guardians of the students in order to discuss the progress of their wards, on regular intervals, to ensure the overall development, in cooperation with the guardians.



3. Online Feedback System:

Students can give their valuable feedback concerning the administration and education being imparted at the college, on the college-website.

4. Online Repository of materials:

The faculty members have created an online repository of materials for all subjects of study to provide additional knowledge to the students. This repository is accessible on every departmental page through the college website and can be accessed both inside and outside the college.

STUDENT LIFE AT KKDC

1. NSS:

The college has a National Service Scheme (Recognized by CU) running successfully since 2010. We take immense pride that our students have



been devotedly engaged in organizing Blood Donation Camps, Health Camps, Awareness Programmes, Health Check-up, and Social Awareness Camp. Our NSS Volunteers also take part in the special camps organized by the NSS unit of the college at under privileged areas nearby. During the time span of the camp, they live with the community and try to experience the problems and living conditions of the people.

2. Eco Club:

The Eco Club of KKDC was established in the year 2015. The main purpose of Eco Club is to make students feel, think and be aware of the current environmental issues. It organizes creative activities such as cleaning the campus, plantation of trees, etc.



3. Literary Society:

The Literacy Society of KKDC was formed in 2015 and it aims to develop the students into promising individuals by providing them a platform to hone their inherent skills of

composition, eloquence etc. It organizes activities like Creative Writing Competition, Debate, Creative Writing Workshop with eminent external experts and movie screenings. By participating in these activities, the students gain the requisite knowledge and exposure to become confident individuals in the future.



4. Cultural Society:

The Cultural Society of the college was established in the year 2015 and it bears responsibility of creating a cultural atmosphere on campus. Various cultural programmes on the occasion of Rabindra Jayanti, Teachers' Day are organized by the Cultural Society. The students actively participate and perform well in various competitions outside the college by obtaining guidance from the Cultural Society. Workshops and competitions on elocution are held at regular intervals.

The Students' Union and NSS Unit of the college also observe Republic Day, Swami Vivekananda's Birthday as National Youth Day, International Mother Language Day and Rabindra Jayanti. Students, Teachers and Non-Teaching Staffs of the college take part actively in all the cultural programmes.



12. Prize Distribution Ceremony :

Prizes are distributed among successful candidates who have topped in CU exam among the college students, winners of debate, Extempore speech and Quiz Competition.
