




## Report on Analysis of Feedback on Curriculum




## Feedback on Curriculum by Students


371 students have responded on the curriculum, out of which 237 respondents are enrolled in honours course and 134 are enrolled in general course. An honours degree course is usually designed to be at a higher standard than a general degree undergraduate course. Thus, the difficulty level of curriculum is different across the programme. On this basis, the feedback on curriculum by students is analyzed separately for honours and general degree programmes.





















## Report on Analysis of Feedback on Teaching-Learning Process



## Feedback on Teaching-Learning Process by Students


371 students have responded on teaching learning process, out of which 229 respondents are enrolled in B.A. course, 137 in B.Com. and 5 in B.Sc. course. The questionnaire consists of several facets of the teaching learning process. Questions vary from specific teaching skills of the teachers to their overall approach to the educational process. Specific skills of the teacher like, subject knowledge, communication skills, class preparation, and use of ICT tools are part of the questionnaire. The overall approach of the teacher and institution with respect to providing the right environment, motivation, interpersonal relationships, feedback etc. forms the second major component of the questionnaire. 15 of 16 questions are objective in nature, while one question is open ended to provide an opportunity to the student to give suggestions and criticisms in their own words. The feedback on curriculum by students is analyzed separately for B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. stream.












## **Student Feedback Summary**

The following observations are drawn from the feedback given by the students on curriculum:

- 10 questions covering various aspects of curriculum were asked to be rated
- The responses given by students of both general and honours degree course are approximately the same
- Majority of the students stated that the depth of the course content is adequate in relation to the expected course outcomes. 66% students are feeling burden of the syllabus in the sense of size of the syllabus is medium. Most of the students reported that they are strongly agree with the relevance of the objectives with the course contents
- More than half of the respondents answered that the syllabus has helped to improve their ability to formulate, analyze and solve problems

#### **Recommendations made by Students on Curriculum:**

• Some English (Honours) students demanded the syllabus to be more insightful. The curriculum for Indian English literature is demanded to be revised. The students want the college to introduce Philosophy as a general subject.

### The following observations are drawn from the feedback given by the students on Teaching-Learning Process:

- Majority of the students from B.A. and B.Sc. stream have opined that 80-90% percentage of the syllabus has been completed by the teachers in the class before their last University Examination. However, more than half of the B.Com. students (64.24%) have suggested that 40-79% of the syllabus has been covered in the class
- 43.80% of students from B.Com. stream have reported irregularities in commencement of their regular classes. Most of the B.A. and B.Sc. students have responded that classes were held on-time
- Majority of students from all streams have opined that the teachers are well prepared for taking classes, could communicate well and explained the subject matter with the help of illustrations
- Majority of the students are happy about the fact that internal evaluation by the teachers were fair and their performance in assignments were discussed in class
- 48.18% of B.Com. students have chosen to be neutral to give their views on the emotional and mental support provided to them by their teachers. However, most of the students from the other two streams felt that the mentoring process in college helped in their emotional growth

#### **Recommendations of Students on Teaching-Learning Process:**

• Some students of B.Com. stream have suggested that even though the teacher-student relation in good, the department runs a low student-teacher ratio. They have demanded a decent student-teacher ratio for more personalized attention and support for each student

## The following observations are drawn from the feedback given by the students on Teaching-Learning Process:

- The students are highly satisfied with the overall working of the college and are happy with the college environment
- Majority of the students have accepted that the dissemination of information from the institution and the way the college addresses their grievances or queries is good and timely
- The facilities provided to the students for skill and personality development by the college is rated to be good. The students are satisfied with the sport, cultural and recreational that are conducted by the college
- The students' union support to the students is also acknowledged
- The institution's social responsibility is also accepted to be good by the students

### Principal's Feedback

Evaluating and offering feedback to teachers is one of the activities of a principal. In order to create a successful college environment and make sure everyone is meeting professional standards, our principal has found an effective way to give feedback to all aspects of the institution. Teachers and non-teaching staff need to know what is expected of them and principal is offering the feedback to help improve their teaching and improve the college.

The principal is satisfied with the following aspects of our institution:

- Competency level of students
- Ability of students to comply with college rules
- Overall discipline observed by students

- Relevance of the courses offered by the institution in relation to students' progression

### **Non-Teaching Staff Feedback**



- Majority of the non-teaching staff are satisfied with the overall work facilities that are provided to them. 83.33 percent of employees are happy with the infrastructure and work environment at their workplace. They are satisfied with the general employee benefits that are provided to them.
- They were satisfied with the opportunities for personal and professional growth. They expressed their satisfaction with the skill enhancement opportunities.
- All the non-teaching staff have reported to enjoy are cordial relationship with colleagues and subordinates, teaching staff and students.
- Majority of the them have agreed to the fact that the workload assigned to them is adequate and non-exploitative in nature. They also agree that their performance, at workplace, always appreciated and praised.





#### Feedback on Curriculum / Syllabus by the Students









- Majority of the students are neutral towards the curriculum that they have studied for the given academic session






#### **Report on Analysis of Feedback on Teaching Learning Process**










- Majority of the students have opined that less than 50% percentage of the syllabus has been completed by the teachers in the class before their last University Examination
- 53.4% responded that on-time classes were held occasionally
- Approximately 42.7% of the students opined that the teachers were well prepared for taking classes, could communicate well and explained with the help of illustrations
- Majority of the students are happy about the fact that internal evaluation by the teachers were fair and their performance in assignments were discussed in class

- Majority of students are yet comfortable in interacting with teachers in online mode


#### Teachers' Feedback on Blended Learning Mode







7. How are you providing study materials to the students? <sup>28</sup> responses




- All the teachers preferred taking online classes through google meet. Some teachers have also Zoom & WhatsApp call to deliver online lectures

- Even though, majority of the classes are taken in offline mode, the study materials are provided to the students in both the modes of learning






- The students are highly satisfied with the overall working of the college








- More of the students agree that the syllabus is up-to-date and is at par with other Universities

- More than 70% students reported that the recommended textbooks are easily available to them




- 63.4% of the respondents said that 80-100% of the syllabus was completed before their University examinations were held

- But overall they are satisfied with online mode of teaching during the pandemic



# How you coped with online classes during the pandemic situation



- 1. Some teachers used Google Hangouts to take classes apart from the above mentioned platforms for taking online classes
- 2. Some teachers are of the opinion that students were disoriented during the pandemic and their general lack of will to attend classes and study led to lower attendance in classes. The online mode of University Examination also contributed to this cause
- 3. Some of the teachers dictated notes during online classes to conduct a regular writing session with the students so as to continue with their writing pace. Some teachers recommended books over the phone to the students
- 4. Some teachers reported that the informal environment of the online classes helped to break down the barrier of formality between the students and teachers.

### Few suggestions put forward by the teachers are:

- We should try to inculcate reading room habit, as the students of this college, be it any discipline, lack the reading aptitude, which can be enforced at its best at the institution only
- Some suggested development of infrastructure like increase in the number of classrooms
- After resuming offline classes it should be the duty of the institution and the teachers to help the students in all aspects of their educational lives as they were immensely affected during the pandemic
- Number of teachers should be increased in some departments and college should provide device and adequate internet facilities for taking online classes
- Students must be more interactive during the online classes
- Final examination conducted by the university should be offline, and the pattern of question paper should be changed as to take open-book examination

The valuable suggestions as expressed by the head of the institution are:


- Change of attitude of all staff is absolutely essential for betterment of the institution
- Proper yearly appraisal system should be introduced by the Government


### Alumni Feedback




## Report of Analysis of Feedback on Curriculum Collected From Different Stakeholders


- Out of 80 respondents, 43 students are honours candidates and rest are general


#### **Feedback on Library**

- Only 13.5% of general students are overtly satisfied with the space available in the library reading room. Majority assess the service to be average







For the academic session 2019-20, feedback was collected from students & teachers of the college during the month of October to December, 2020. Obtained Feedback was analyzed by Feedback cell and submitted to IQAC.

After discussion on feedback analysis report of 2019-20 at IQAC meeting held on 19.02.2021. The members came to the conclusion that this year number of respondent in students' is insufficient to take any action based on report. Probably this happened due to covid-19 outbreak. However, keeping in mind about the situation the house decided to take following actions for betterment of the students:

- To complete the syllabus on time and to meet the shortfall of teachers, online faculty exchange programmes with other colleges has decided to be initiated.

Last year, the overall responses on all the given parameters indicated moderate to high level of satisfaction on the part of the students. The students are advised to provide their feedback judiciously. The parents' feedback is collected offline.





The activities of the institution in the above five sections are being analyzed to create a quality profile for the year in relation to institutional vision and goals.








- Out of 199 respondents, majority of the students are comfortable in the classroom and college premises

- ❖ The skill and personality development support provided b ythe college is moderately acceptable to the students





- ❖ The students are satisfied with the displaying of result, attendance record on time and the schedule of University programmes in the college notice board








❖ The students complimented on a variety of things including the library staff, library resources and services and the library's physical and virtual environment


#### **Feedback on Computer Laboratory**






- ❖ The computer laboratory of the institution is well-facilitated with modern equipments and computer aids

- ❖ The laboratory staff is also found to be very co-operative and helpful


#### **Feedback on Canteen**






- The working of the college canteen is found to be satisfactory in terms of cleanliness, menu, quality of food and the prices
- ❖ The hygiene of the food is also found to be moderately acceptable to the students


#### Feedback on Principal

#### **Parents Feedback:**

Survey was conducted to assess the satisfaction of parents regarding the services of the college to gain an insight into how college could improve on various parameters. ## Action Taken Report on Feedback Analysis for the Academic Session 2018-2019
